

## Academic teams place second at UConn

A combined team from Trumbull High's Model United Nations and Debate clubs came in second at the World Affairs Forum's Academic World Quest held at UConn Stamford on March 6.

The competition itself consists of teams of four students representing their schools at tables in an open hall. Teammates work together answering questions dis-

played in sequence on a large screen.

Questions are on selected topics in world affairs, presented in rounds of about 10 questions each. This year's topics were: Oman, the Caribbean Islands, Pandemics, Genocide, International Migration Trends, Food Production and Consumption, World Music, the World Cup, and Current Events.
