

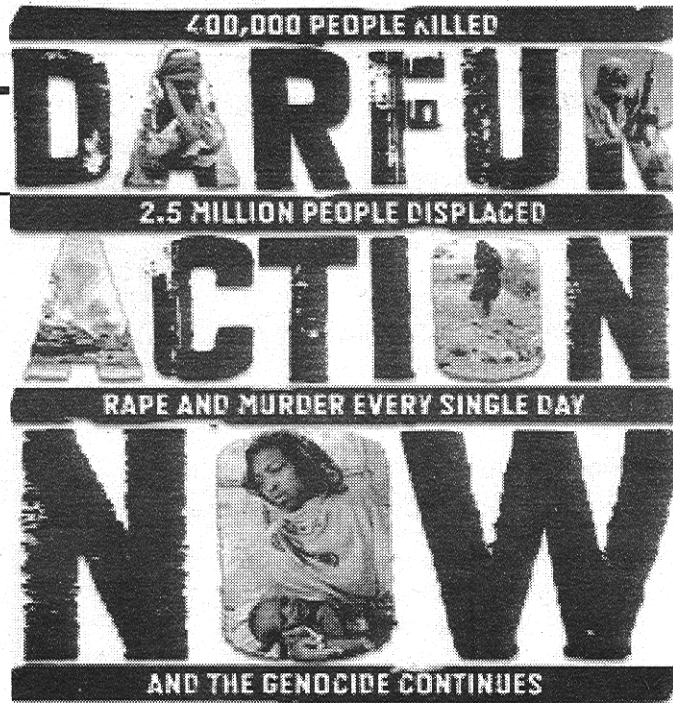
STAND Club
